What does Bird Town PA provide for a municipality?


- Provides a state-wide structured program with congruous goals

Audubon: Bird-Friendly Habitat

- · Emphasis: Safe and healthy habitat for birds
- Requirements: Demographic data on property: size, rural, suburban, etc. Four categories of habitat are listed: Food,
 Shelter, Water, Nesting At least 2 items in food and one each in shelter, water and nesting An additional 19 question survey asks for percentages for Bird-Friendly characteristics but it is not clear how these questions impact your acceptance.
- Benefits: Audubon has many downloadable and interactive resources including Plants for Birds a customizable database for native plants for your location with high bird value. The Audubon name is instantly recognizable.
- · Cost: \$25 application fee includes cost of yard sign

Homegrown National Park



- · Emphasis: Creating habitat for wildlife one yard at a time
- · Requirements: Use the link to register and then begin to add plantings of native plants for your map
- . Benefits: Native plants and other resources; put your property on the map; create and track native plant goals
- · Costs: Free registration, free downloadable sign for printing

- Includes 10 organizations, each offers a very similar path to develop sustainable and wildlife friendly properties.
- Our goal is to engage property owners and managers who care about providing good habitat for ecological diversity and a sustainable future.
- It is our vision to build highways of sustenance and safety to counterbalance the tremendous loss of habitat for birds, plants, and all native species.






